Jesus talks with the Samaritan woman, breaking down boundaries

● Red, symbolizing the blood of martyrs and innocents of the Americas, is the colour of passion – for the continent where many need the new fire of faith.

The 3rd Mission Mystery:

Jesus cures the centurion's servant, serving and healing

● White, symbolizing the seat of pope in Europe, is the colour of peace – for the continent where nations are scarred by many wars.

The 4th Mission Mystery:

Jesus sends out his disciples, giving them the great mission

● Yellow, symbolizing the light of the rising sun in Asia, is the colour of happiness – for the continent where many fall into despair.

The 5th Mission Mystery:

Jesus converts Paul, starting off the expansion of the faith
